Over the next three weeks, our school will be embarking on our annual, communitywide shared reading event called, *One Author, One Ryerson*. This year we are switching it up a bit! Students in grades K-2 will all get an early chapter book and student is grades 3-5 will get a chapter book written by the same author, Jaqueline Davies. One book will be sent home with each student, and every family reads that book at home over the course of three weeks.

Reading aloud at home is valuable because it better prepares your child to be an effective reader, and it is also a fun, worthwhile family activity. With the *One Author, One Ryerson* program, we aim to build a Community of Readers at our school. Everyone – students, parents, teachers, even administrative staff will all be following along together.

Today, your child received a copy of *Lemonade Crime*. Along with the book, you received a reading schedule so that you can keep up at home. We have provided questions on the calendar to help guide the book discussion at home.
